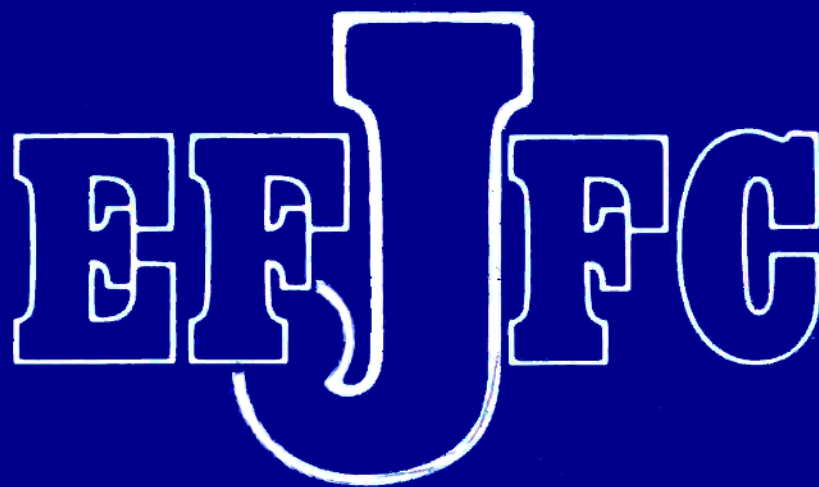

Prologue

1994 has been a rather quiet season in terms of issues for the committee. It was with pleasure, mainly to our confidence in the canteen being able to produce a profit of \$2,500 again, that we were able to keep the playing fees at the 1993 level, apart from the 17's whose fees were increased by \$5 this year. It was also recognised we would recoup an increased return on our 1993 expenditure on socks and shorts. In retrospect, both assessments proved correct with the canteen returning \$2,900 profit, for which we acknowledge the immense work of Elaine and John Jenkins. The sales of socks and shorts were also good, although short sales at the senior level were not trading well. When the canteen was broken into early in the season and our total supply of shorts was stolen, we at least, through insurance, were able to recoup our costs. A decision was made at the 1993 Annual General Meeting not to purchase further shorts because of the workload involved in managing sales.

A decision of significance was whether our Club would support a motion of the Willetton Junior Football Club to introduce a 16's competition next season. It was resolved that we would oppose the motion on the grounds that it would decimate the 17's competition and a 16's competition would not enhance the development of players. At Junior Council level Willetton's motion was successful, albeit our Club's position was recognised. Most clubs voted on the premise of retention

of players generally lost to football at this level. Our Club has already resolved we will not be fielding a 16's team in 1995 for the reasons as outlined.

There was only one coaching change this year with Damian Shanks taking charge of the 13's team, from Paul Lyons who had them the previous year. Damian was a former player at the Club and came to us with many recent years' experience umpiring juniors in the South Fremantle zone.

A Quiz Night was held in August which raised approximately \$800 and we thank Matt Matthews and Kevin Murphy in particular, as well as others involved for their efforts.

Team wind-ups were changed this year to primarily make the junior teams' presentations more meaningful. It is generally considered that holding their wind-up on the last day of the season was a success. Unfortunately, this was not possible with the older age groups because of the 17's being in the finals, which meant the continuance of fairest and best voting, a delay in ordering trophies, allowances for WAFL and AFL finals and school holidays.

All in all the season was a success and on behalf of the committee I wish to thank members and others who offered their participation and support throughout 1994.

We also thank Bob Pearse, our Secretary for the past five years for his service and congratulate him on being awarded Life Membership.

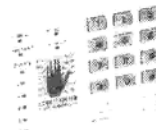

President's Report

The year got off to a poor start with a disappointing role up to our Registration Day. This meant we were on the backfoot trying to guess playing numbers and making decisions on which teams to nominate to Junior Council before the closing date. It also increased the workload on the Registrar and Team Managers in relation to chasing up fees and registration details. We intend to re-examine our approach in 1995.

The final outcome after ringing many boys to determine whether they intended playing was that we fielded the same number of teams as in 1993. However, overall our playing numbers did drop by approximately 30, with a corresponding shortfall in fees of \$1,200. In relation to our records, I would like to thank Derek Whitfield, Bob Pearce and John Jenkins who all put in a tremendous effort early in the season to transfer existing records onto Derek's computer.

Despite this reduced revenue, through fundraising \$800 at the Quiz Night and the \$2,900 profit in the canteen for which we sincerely thank Elaine and John Jenkins, the Club has continued a sound financial management approach to its operations. The real winners are of course the fee paying parent/s.

On the playing side we can be proud of our development achievements with many boys from the 14's in particular, as well as the 15's and 17's participating in combined side training or selection.

It was also a great achievement for both Adam Bergen and John Neesham to take out the Runner-Up Fairest and Best trophies in the District Association 13's and 15's respectively.

I look forward to another good season in 1995.

History of Training Lights

Back in the mid 1970's, the Committee of the time had the visionary presence to see that it was critical to plan for the installation of lights, to assist in the competitiveness and development of our senior boys, many of whom had to work in those days, before trudging off to training as 16 or 17-year-olds.

There was substantial effort in the form of fundraising through newspaper collections and other events, so I am told by the likes of Cyril King and Les Edmonds. This enabled the Committee of the time to provide sufficient funds, in conjunction with some funding from the Town Council, to see the lights in operation by the late 1970's.

In our 40th year in 1995, I think it is important to reflect on and remember the valuable input our past members put into the Club, which has certainly benefited many a player's development and eased the need for coaches to plan early training sessions in the winter months.

To all those involved at that time, we are truly grateful.

Junior Council Report

The East Fremantle Football Club Junior Council, which administers the competition in the East Fremantle zone, had a mixed season.

Two new Recorders were appointed to replace Brian Dearle from the previous year. Unfortunately, the person who took on the senior teams recording of game outcomes and registrations, etc. resigned mid-season, which threw all clubs competing for final berths into confusion as premiership tables were unavailable. Wayne Dayle, the President of Junior Council, saved the day by taking on the role and as a Club we acknowledged his efforts.

Administration of the 17's competition returned to Junior Council this year from the defunct Fremantle Districts Football League. The number of teams participating in 17's was not as expected. Only seven clubs were able to field a side in the 17's, where eight or more sides were expected. This is a big difference to the 13's with thirteen teams participating. The 14's combined side was successful with a grand final win, having won as 13-year-olds the previous year.

As usual our club was rostered to sell raffle tickets at a League game. A special thank you to Colin Constantine, who was the only parent to help Bob Pearce and myself out in this regard.

The Council agreed to appoint a Metropolitan Development Officer in 1995 with part funding by the Football Development Trust. The balance of funding will come via a levy on junior clubs who will be the main beneficiaries. The officer will service approximately 110 teams within the District, plus primary and high schools which link to local teams.

Junior Council also agreed to provide extra funding to appoint two Assistant Umpires' Advisers to improve the quality of our umpires which will also ultimately benefit players and spectators in general.

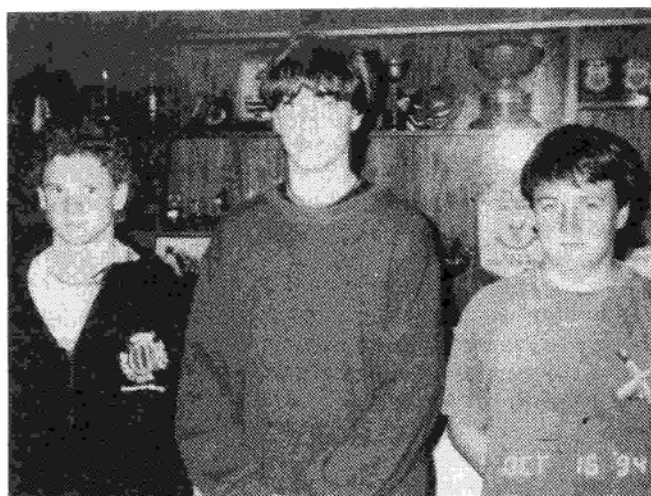

NOTICE TO ADVERTISERS

The Trade Practices Act, 1974 came into force on October, 1974 (amended). There are important new provisions in that Act which contain strict regulations on advertising and all advertisers and advertising agents are advised to study those provisions very carefully.

It can be an offence for anyone to engage, in trade or commerce, in conduct "misleading or deceptive". In particular Section 53 contains prohibitions from doing any of the following in connection with the promotion, by any means, of the supply or use of goods or services:

- (a) falsely represent that goods are of a particular standard, quality, value, grade, composition, style or model or have had a particular history or particular previous use;
- (aa) falsely represent that services are of a particular standard, quality, value or grade;
- (b) falsely represent that goods are new;
- (bb) falsely represent that a particular person has agreed to acquire goods or services;
- (c) represent that goods or services have sponsorship, approval, performance characteristics, accessories, uses or benefits they do not have;
- (d) represent that the corporation has a sponsorship, approval or affiliation it does not have;
- (e) make a false or misleading representation with respect to the price of goods or services;
- (ea) make a false or misleading representation concerning the availability of facilities for the repair of goods or of spare parts for goods;
- (eb) make a false or misleading representation concerning the place of origin of goods;
- (f) make a false or misleading representation concerning the need for any goods or services; or
- (g) make a false or misleading representation concerning the existence, exclusion or effect of any condition, warranty, guarantee, right or remedy.

Penalties for breach of Part 5 other than section 52, 65Q or 65R or subsection 65F (9).

- (f) in the case of a person not being a body corporate — by a fine not exceeding \$40,000; or
- (g) in the case of a person being a body corporate — by a fine not exceeding \$200,000.

The W.A. Fair Trading Act contains similar provisions to those of the Trade Practices Act and extend the prohibition to persons as well as corporations.

It is not possible for this company to ensure that advertisements which are published in this magazine comply with the Act and the responsibility must therefore be on the person, company or advertising agency submitting the advertisements for publication.

In some cases, other suburbs can field up to three teams in the competition. Ben Edwards — Ben played as a wingman or forward and did some great work during the year. He has good skills and takes a great mark. Ben has a promising future.

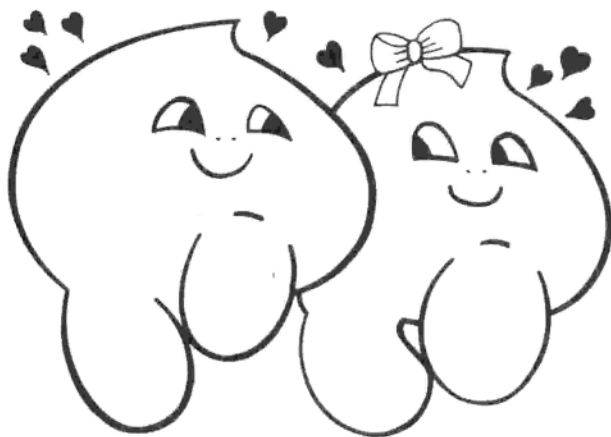

Stephen Pearse — Stephen played only a handful of games with the team before we lost him to the Colts. Stephen is a good all-round footballer and he was a very bright future in football.

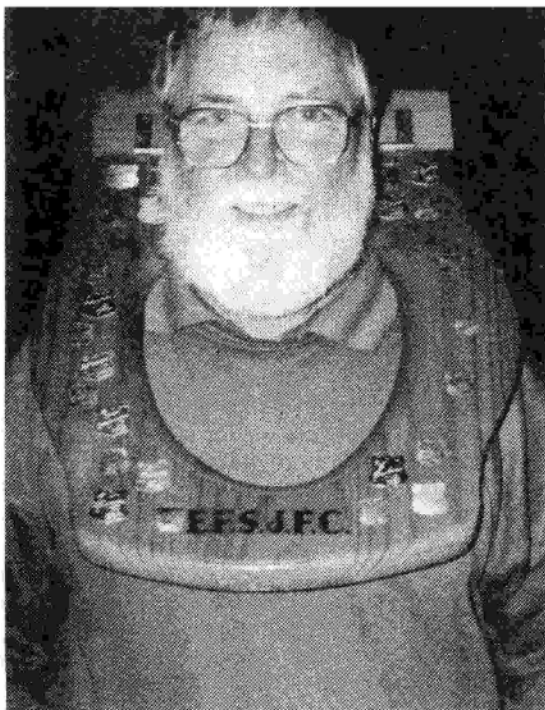

Dear Sir,

I respond to your letter dated 2 September, 1994. In that letter you ask for comments on a number of matters.

In respect to the clubrooms, the proposition most favoured by Council is to replace rather than renovate the clubrooms. However, this is frustrated by the fact that the cost of replacement is significantly higher than the \$65,000 allocated for the renovations.

The position of maintenance of the lights at Henry Jeffery Oval is one that will probably give both Council and the club some concern in the future. As I recall, the lights were placed pursuant to a grant received by the Council/club and an additional one-third contribution from both Council and the club. At that time no specific arrangement appears to have been made as to their future maintenance and, obviously in the long term, their replacement. Ongoing maintenance appears to have been broadly shared between the club and Council, and it would appear likely that this would continue.

In respect to the rocks being removed from areas adjacent to the clubrooms, I would confirm that I have asked the Works Supervisor to address this situation.

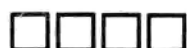
